# Maintaining Proper Following Time

#### ■ 2 Seconds

Permits driver time to steer out of <u>problem</u>
 <u>areas</u> at speeds up to 65 m.p.h. and <u>brake</u> out of problem areas at speeds <u>UNDER 35 M.P.H.</u>

#### ■ 3 Seconds

- Permits driver time to steer out of <u>problem</u> <u>areas</u> at speeds up to 65 m.p.h. and <u>brake</u> out of problem areas at speeds <u>UNDER 45 M.P.H.</u>


# Maintaining Proper Following Time (con't)

- 4 Seconds
  - Permits driver time to steer out of <u>problem</u>
     areas at speeds up to 65 m.p.h and <u>brake</u> out
     of problem areas at speeds to legal limit of 65
     M.P.H.

# How do I know my following time?

- Find a fixed object ahead of you.
- When the rear bumper of the vehicle ahead of you passes that object, start counting--one-thousand one, one-thousand two...
- When the front bumper on your vehicle passes the fixed object, stop counting, that is your following time.
- To reduce risk, be at least 4 seconds behind the vehicle you are following.
