




You are the driver of the Red car.


- Sign "A" reads Rainier Next Five Exits

Exit 101 - 1st Ave 1 mile


Exit 103 - 20th Ave 2 1/2 miles




1. Which lane should you drive in if you will not be exiting in Rainier?




Stay in the middle lane



2. If you will be taking exit 101 (1 mile), what lane should you choose?




Change to the Outside lane # 3




3. You are traveling about 60 mph and the "pack" of cars ahead is traveling about 55 mph.


What action should you take?




Slow down to about 55 mph and leave space




4. The "pack" of cars ahead is going about 55 mph. You have been traveling at 60 mph. What will you do?



Change into the inside lane # 1 and pass




5. What is the inside general driving lane # 1 legally to be used for on the freeway?

■ It can also be used to exit to the left




5. What if the inside lane # 1 is a diamond lane?

- carpools (watch for signs indicating how many occupants) and motorcycles







7. What kind of space cushion do you need to leave on the freeway?




At least 4 seconds, but prefer 5 seconds




Leave 5 to 6 seconds when:

- the weather conditions are bad




8. What is the cause of most crashes on the freeway?



Following too close




9. Will an Interstate route that runs North and South end in an odd or even number?



Odd number


For example I-5 runs north and south through Seattle

- Plan to move out of this position as soon as possible






What is wrong with the red car's position?




- It is in the blindspot of the yellow car
- Do not stay in other people's blindspot area for more than a couple of seconds

What is wrong with the red car's position?




- It is in the blindspot of the truck
- Either pass the truck quickly or slow to get out of its blindspot

What's wrong if this is all you see?




- You are tailgating
- You need 5 seconds of following space


What's about to happen if this is all you see?




- You are about to rear-end a truck
- Hope your front bumper is as high as the truck's rear bumper!






