

- * You must be 16 years old.
- * Custodial Parent
 - Parent must have photo I.D.
 - Must have document to connect child to parent
- * Birth Certificate
- * TSE Completion Certificate
- * Instruction Permit
- * Testing Fee

Knowledge Test:


- Common Errors
 - ! Not reading all the answers prior to selecting the BEST answer
 - ! Did not understand a word or phraseand did not ask
 - ! Did not look carefully at the picture
 - Prior to starting the test, did not advise the examiner of special needs



Knowledge Test:



- Read ALL the answers prior to selecting the BEST answer
- If there is a word or phrase you do not understand, ask for help
- Look CAREFULLY at each picture
- Advise the examiner BEFORE starting test, of special needs.




Disqualification Waiting Periods

- Knowledge Test
 - 1st Try- 4 hours
 - 2nd Try- 3 days
 - 3rd Try- 1 Week (reapply)
- Drive Test
 - •1st Try-1 Week
 - 2nd Try- 1-3 Weeks
 - 3rd Try- 1-3 Weeks (Reapply)



Drive Test Appointment

- Must have completed TSE
- Must be at least 16 years old



- Must have qualified on the Knowledge Test
 - If you qualified on the knowledge test when you obtained your instruction permit, you may call for an appointment.
 - Must arrive at the office 30 minutes prior to your appointment time with the required documents /guardian/fee.
- Drive test appointment is made

The Vehicle

- Must be legal and safe
 - Current license
 - Insurance
 - Brake light/turn signals
 - Seatbelts




• Try to use a vehicle you have driven before.The examiner cannot make adjustments to the score because you are driving an unfamiliar vehicle.

The Vehicle (con't)

- No passengers or animals will be allowed to ride in the vehicle during the drive test.
- KNOW YOUR HAND SIGNALS
 - You will be asked to demonstrate your knowledge of the hand signals at the start of your drive test.
 - If you do not know your hand signals your test may be delayed-until you know them.

Reasons for Disqualification

- Violation of the Law
 - Fail to stop for a sign/light
 - Fail to yield to an emergency vehicle
 - Speed
 - Illegal turns- Turning from the wrong lane
 - Driving in the wrong lane
 - Collision

Reasons for Disqualifications

- Dangerous Actions
 - Failing to yield to an oncoming vehicle
 - Backing over the centerline (two wheels)
 - Anytime the examiner takes verbal or physical control of the vehicle
 - Anytime another vehicle must take evasive action to avoid an accident

Reasons for Disqualification

- Failure to Perform
 - If you refuse to attempt a maneuver, a 25 point deduction is made and you disqualify.
- Deductions
 - must have a qualifying score of 80%.
 - You may lose up to 20 mpoints and qualify as long as you have not been disqualified due to a collision, violation of the law, dangerous action, or failure to perform.

MIP-Minor In Possession

- First Offense- Revoked for 1 Year or age 17 (whichever is longer)
- Second Offense- Revoked for 2 years or age 18 (whichever is longer)
- A vehicle does NOT have to be involved
- MIP Law includes drugs and/or alcohol



MIP- (con't)

- In order to reinstate, you will be required to take all your tests over again.
- A reissue fee will be required in addition to the testing and license fee.

An impaired driver who has become fully aware of their handicap and is compensating for it, is usually a better risk than an unimpaired driver with an exaggerated idea of their abilities.
