




- Baking Soda and Water






- What might happen if the terminals aren't clean?
- Your car might not start.
- How can you tell how many volts a battery is?
- What is the "Glowing Eye" on a battery?
- It tells you if your battery is charged or not.


- Explain how to Jump start a car with a dead battery.
  - Positive from good battery to positive on bad battery. Negative from bad battery to ground (not negative on good battery).
- What is the purpose of an Alternator?
- To charge the Battery.
- What are some clues that the alternator is not working properly?
- Car starts hard or not at all, lights are dim



- How can you tell the fan belt is too loose?
- More than one half inch of slack.
- When checking the belts, do you look at the outside or inside for wear?
- **■**Inside



- Yearly or mileage
- It takes the dirt out of the air before it enters your engine.






- What is the problem when the gas filter gets dirty?
- Your car will not get enough fuel: lose power, engine dies, runs rough





- How often should you check the radiator fluid?
- Weekly and more often if you have to add coolant often.
- What can happen when anti-freeze gets old?
- It doesn't work; it won't protect your engine.

- What does engine oil do?
- □ Cleans
- **■** Cools
- Lubricates
- How much oil do you add, if the oil comes up to the ADD mark on the dipstick?
- One quart






- If the oil pressure light comes on while driving, you should:
- pull over
- turn engine off
- What oil weights do you use:
- 10 or 20 Winter
- **30** or 40 Summer
- 10/30 or 10/40 All Seasons





- The automatic transmission fluid should be checked with the engine:
- **■** running
- If the dipstick says add then put in:
- One pint of transmission fluid
- What does dark brake fluid mean?
- Its old; you need to change your brake fluid


- Should you fill the wiper fluid container with regular water?
- No, it could freeze and crack the container.
- What does Octane do for your gas?
- It makes it burn better.







- Where would you find the proper air pressure for your tires?
- On the side of the tire.
- Why do you rotate your tires?
- To extend the tire life and to get more even tire wear.



Turn a penny upside-down, place it in the tread of your tire. If you can see all of Lincoln's head, then your tires are illegal. You need to get new tires.





- What causes a tire to wear in these places?
- On one side Bad wheel alignment
- On both sides Under inflated, not enough air pressure.
- In the middle Over inflated, too much air pressure



- Explain how to change a flat tire.
- See Owner's manual.
- What is the purpose of Shock Absorbers, and how do you check them?
- To give you a smooth and level ride.
- By doing the "Bounce Test."



- Why should you check your spare tire regularly?
- So that it will be ready when you need it.
- What does ASE mean?
- Automotive Service Excellence



- What are some clues that your seatbelts are no longer working properly?
- They are stretched out, torn, or don't retract all the way.
- What might the problem be with your seatbelts, if your car has been in an accident?
- They might not protect you properly if you get in another accident.



- List some standard equipment that all drivers should carry in case of an emergency.
- Spare tire
- **■**Jack
- Tire Iron
- Flares or reflectors
- First aid kit
- **■** Fire Extinguisher



- List some other items that drivers might carry in their car for emergencies. List some of the more unusual items.
